Bob Heil, Ham Nation, and the Pine Board Project by Virginia Smith NV5F

Last month's club meeting was great fun, and we were happy to have so many members and guests come out to participate in our Skype meeting with Bob Heil, K9EID. His lifetime in ham radio and sound engineering, as well as music is a treasure to us all, to say the least. All should be encouraged to take full advantage of his willingness to share his love of our great hobby and his expertise in the basics of what makes good radio. For those who are not aware of Bob Heil's Ham Nation program, you would benefit from taking the time to look it up on YouTube, where all of the nearly 300 shows are available in their entirety. Bob launched this weekly video webcast on twit.tv back in 2011. TWIT stands for "This Week in Tech," which is an online "TV channel" dedicated to the latest in technology. Ham Nation is unique among its programs, which tend to focus on computers, software, and general gadgetry, all of which converge neatly on Ham Nation. This interdisciplinary role which it plays might lead one to consider radio as the root of all electronic technology. You can watch Ham Nation live each Wednesday night on twit.tv at 8:00 PM Central.

Among Ham Nation's regular hosts are - of course - Bob Heil K9EID, Gordon West WB6NOA, George Thomas W5JDX, and Don Wilbanks AE5DW with his weekly recap of the top stories from "Amateur Radio Newsline." There are also alternating biweekly segments on contesting/DX and viewer submitted photos and videos. The video webcast "Ham Radio Now" has it's roots in the early days of Ham Nation when that show's creator Gary Pearce KN4AQ would sit in for Bob and produced some wonderful video segments which soon took on a life of their own. George Thomas was also an early contributor to Ham Nation with his extremely popular segment entitled "Smoke and Solder," based on humorous yet informative bits from his own webcast, "Amateur Logic," a monthly program which predates Ham Nation by several years. George also recently launched a ham radio education webcast entitled "Ham College." Any ham could brush up on concepts which have rusted a little since the last license exam with Ham College. Both "Ham College" and "Amateur Logic" are inexhaustibly packed George's dry and nerdy sense of humor, as well as information, projects and entertainment. Go back and at least watch the yearly holiday shows, which somehow manage to mix ham radio, Christmas and comedy.

Unlike Ham Nation, which must pack several detailed segments into about an hour, George's programs are more leisurely, open-ended, and refreshingly distracted These shows play like an evening with geeky friends, covering subjects like food, beer, and old sci-fi movies and shows, while managing to inform on current radio and computer technology, as well as communication history. George and his co-host Tommy Martin N5ZNO have an ongoing food exchange with their recurring Skype co-hosts, Peter Barrett VK3PB from Australia, and Mike Morneau VE3MIC from Canada. There's nothing like watching two guys from Mississippi attempting to eat Vegamite! (In a later segment, they get Peter to eat a bowl of grits!)

Ham Nation is also peppered with ongoing "plots," not the least of which being Bob Heil's current retro radio romp, "The Pine Board Project." The project is in keeping with Bob's love of learning and understanding radio and is designed to take those old and new to ham radio through a series of small projects, beginning with a simple power supply built with components mounted on a small scrap of pine board and ultimately culminating in several

components (also built on pine boards) to comprise an AM tube transmitter with accompanying mic pre-amp which will operate at QRP output and work on 80 meters AM and CW. The point is seeing how simple radio is and to understand how it works by seeing everything and to enjoy being able to home brew something from scratch and to see it work! Bob reports that the first few segments of the Pine Board Project on Ham Nation this spring have been wildly popular. There are plans to put together a website which will include parts lists, schematics and distributor information for classic parts. Of course, those who are anxious to get going and have not seen the Ham Nation episodes can catch up with the back episodes on YouTube.

Ham Nation and Amateur Logic also have companion websites which each provide a WIKI with show notes and index of topics for each episode, so one can even hand pick the shows that are of interest. And, of course there are countless other projects from simple to complicated: from making a telegraph with batteries and wires, to replacing a broken laptop screen! These programs are invaluable to hams and technology fans, a veritable university education in communication and technology - all very entertaining and all for free! So use them and enjoy them, and you will soon find that our hobby is truly inexhaustible... and quite accessible.

Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

David KB3UBD called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

David informed the membership that a survey was sent to the membership by the Membership Committee Chair, Gray Strickland KG5CEA. If any AARC members would be interested in volunteering on the Membership Committee, contact Gray.

The minutes for the February meetings were submitted for publication in the March 2017 newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.
