ARRL World Phone Contest March 3, 2018

On Saturday March 3rd an enthusiastic little group from the Arlington Amateur Radio Club met at Virginia, NV5F's house to try their hand on the HF bands. Perhaps a DX contest is an overwhelming first outing: wall-to-wall stations calling, pileups of hundreds of ops answering all at once! however these determined souls were not thwarted by the cacophony of hams calling "CQ contest" following it a string of, often unintelligible, phonetics in unfamiliar accents. The contest itself is an ideal training ground, since all DX entities are obliged to work US or Canadian stations, thus offering the newcomer ample opportunities to talk to a wide variety of countries and to feel the amazement which inevitably follows the first contact with a voice that is thousands of miles away!

Rob NV5E supplied us with his excellent Elecraft station complete with 500 watts of power and Heil Sound headset Mary KG5URO, Scott AE5PC, Steve KZ5MSE, and John (I didn't catch your call)stopped by, and most took a turn at the mic with Rob and Virginia coaching. Rob's right hand Erin came by for a bit, and we all visited and ate and made about 50 contacts as a group. Rob left his station set up and Virginia worked into the evening, increasing the club total to 110 QSO's for a total of about 50 countries.

Everyone had a great time and learned a lot we are planning to have more club operating activities soon, including the club picnic in May, and, of course, Field Day in June. So please consider attending future events with the intention of getting on the air! The more the merrier!

TSPOTA is an annual event that takes place on the second full weekend in April, (except when Easter falls on the second weekend, then the contest is moved to the first weekend of April). This year it will be April 7-8, 2018. TSPOTA is a low pressure, fun contest, designed to give Texas hams that have been house bound during the winter, a chance to go to a local state park and make a few contacts. Meeting Minutes

February 2018 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:30 pm on February 16th, 2018 by the President, Rob NV5E. Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS. Absent was Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT.

Rob NV5E called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

The minutes for the January meetings were submitted for publication in the February newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Virginia NV5F informed the membership that the evening's presentation would be given by Bob Ballard KG5SQJ on the topic of manually programming a Baofeng HT radio. A Remote (via Skype) presentation by DX Engineering is being coordinated. DX Engineering is open to suggestions, so submit your questions or suggestions to Virginia who will forward them.

On March 3rd, Virginia will host, at her home, a station participating in the ARRL International DX contest from approximately 10 am to 6 pm. Virginia will also run an AARC 2-meter net on the Saturdays following the club meeting to provide an opportunity for club members to get on the air.

Maurice KM5RF submitted the treasurer's report for publication in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept for audit the report as published.

Maurice reported that the audit committee completed the audit of the 2017 financial records.

As repeater trustee, he reported that the repeaters are in working order. He would like to make an upgrade to the 440 repeater, and he'll provide more information next month.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10 am at 401 W. Sanford St (use the north side entrance). There are no training sessions being held at this time. He is close to having enough people interested in participating in the General Class session. He is also open to holding a CW training session.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. If you would like any items of interest to appear in the newsletter, please submit them to Trey no later than the Sunday before the club meeting.

Rob NV5E mentioned that the AARC picnic will be held on May 19th at River Legacy Park. A motion was made and carried to reimburse David Spore for the \$80 cost of the reservation.

A break was taken at 8:04 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:20 pm with a presentation by Bob Ballard on how

to manually program Baofeng HT radios.

The meeting adjourned at 9:24 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 29 people in attendance, 25 indicating AARC membership.

Rob NV5E called the meeting to order.

Rob NV5E reported that David Spore successfully made a reservation for May 19th at River Legacy Park for the AARC picnic. He also made a motion to approve the addition of himself and Don Kovatch N5YAK to the Repeater Committee. The motion carried.

Virginia informed the board that the presentation for February will be given by Bob Ballard on the topic of Baofeng HT radio programming. She is also planning a presentation by DX Engineering (via Skype). DX Engineering takes requests for presentation topics, so Virginia will forward ideas from the membership to DX Engineering. She will host a
