Ten-Ten International Net Breakfast Club

In 1983, Steve KD5ZD had gotten his Advanced Class License and was listening on the 10-meter band one evening when he discovered the Ten-Ten International Net. This organization of amateur radio operators was founded in 1962 and promotes usage of the 10-meter band. The Net Controller at that time was Tom W5GVP. When Tom asked for check-ins, Steve checked in. After three weeks of joining in on the nets, Tom invited Steve to join the group for Breakfast & Coffee at 8 a.m. on Saturday morning at the Crossroads Cafe in Arlington, Texas. The cafe was a real greasy spoon! Steve joined the Breakfast & Coffee bunch and later became a member of the Ten-Ten International Net. Steve said that this original group included Tom W5GVP, Tiger K5TGE, V.V. N5POS, and a few other 10-10ers that are now silent keys. Tiger and V.V. were former fighter pilots in World War II. Steve KD5ZD and Phil N5PWW have fond memories of their get-togethers.

In 1989, after the Crossroads Cafe closed, the Ten-Ten International Net group started a search for a new place to meet. They found the Pioneer Restaurant in Arlington. The group has been going there ever since and having a blast!

Nine years ago, Bill W5WJH joined up with the group at the Pioneer Restaurant. Not long after that, Bill took over as Net Controller of the Cowtown and Lone Star Chapters of the Ten-Ten International Net. Both nets are at 8 p.m. CDT at 28,460 MHz. Meeting Minutes

September 2018 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:30 pm on September 21st, 2018 by the President, Rob NV5E. Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS. Absent was the Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT.

Rob NV5E called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the treasurer's report as published in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published. He informed the membership of his plan to install the new repeater RF amplifier during the first weekend of November.

The minutes for the August meetings were submitted for publication in the September newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Virginia NV5F reported that in place of a formal presentation, the club would have a swap meet. In October there will be a program presented by Valeria Hotzfeld, via Skype, on the Puerto Rico hurricane assistance trip. November will be the election of club officers, followed by a show-and-tell.

On behalf of Bill AE5BT, Rob NV5E let the membership know of the plans to travel to Sid Richardson Scout Range, as part of JOTA, on Saturday, October 20th. The departure time will be around 8:30 am from 501 West Sanford Street for the 2 hour trip to Bridgeport. Once on location, the stations will be set up and operated for approximately 4 hours. The departure time from SRSR will be approximately 5 pm. Please contact Bill if you would like to participate.

Rob NV5E reiterated the plan to utilize a beam antenna for operations during Field Day 2019. If anyone has access or knows of someone with access to a lift/bucket truck which could be used during that weekend to erect a beam antenna to a height of 25 to 30 feet, please contact Bill.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10 am at 401 W. Sanford St. (use the north side entrance). There are currently no scheduled training sessions. With the lack of interest in a Morse code class, it appears it may be postponed until 2019.

David Walker W5DJO informed the membership that there will be two radio operator classes being held soon, and that Linda McMillen W5LMC has taken over the responsibility of communications during the monthly siren testing.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter. If you would like any items of interest to appear in the newsletter, please submit them to Trey starting the first weekend of the month.

David Spore KB3UBD, Membership Committee chair, informed the membership of the plans to have a club camping trip at Cedar Hill State Park on the weekend of October 12th-14th. The AARC promotional flyers and AARC contact information business cards have both been printed. The Membership Committee would like to review AARC historical information and artifacts to build a scrap book, and scan the documents to create an electronic archive.

Rob NV5E informed the membership that the election of club officers will be held in November and that all officers are open.

A motion was made to make a donation in the sum of \$300 to SafeHaven of Tarrant County. The motion was seconded and carried.

A break was taken at 8:08 pm, which signaled the start of the club swap meet.

The meeting adjourned at 8:30 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 23 people in attendance, 22 indicating AARC membership.

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on September 21st, 2018 at 6:30 pm. Absent was Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT.

Rob NV5E called the meeting to order.

On behalf of Bill AE5BT, Rob reported that Bill will be participating in JOTA (Jamboree On The Air) on Saturday, October 20th, 2018 at Sid Richardson Scout Ranch. Anyone wishing to participate should contact Bill to coordinate the rally point and time of departure from Arlington, as well as carpooling options.

Rob NV5E would like to bring before the membership the motion to make a donation to SafeHaven of Tarrant County.

Virginia NV5F informed the board that next month's presentation will be given by Valeria Hotzfeld NV9L, via Skype, about her trip to Puerto Rico to provide assistance after the hurricane. In November, there will be a show-and-tell to be held after the election of club officers.

Andy KB2VQA submitted the August meeting minutes to Trey for publication in the September newsletter.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report with the board. There is currently a PayPal charge dispute, resulting in a negative balance. Maurice has moved \$45 to the account to return the balance to \$0, allowing the AARC PayPal account to continue to accept transactions. Maurice has been in contact with PayPal to resolve the issue.

Maurice has set a tentative date of November 3rd for the installation of the new repeater RF amplifier. At the November club meeting, he plans on bringing his RF spectrum analyzer as part of a show-and-tell, and allow members to test their radios.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month, with the next session being held on October 6th. There are no plans for training sessions at this time. There has not been sufficient interest in a Morse code class.

Trey AF5XS published and distributed the newsletter.

The meeting adjourned at 6:46 pm.
