## **Meeting Minutes**

# pril 2019 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order at 7:30 pm on April 19th, 2019 by the President, Virginia NV5F. Other board members present included Vice President, Mary AE6Q; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; as well as Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW. Absent were Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Virginia NV5F called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Phil N5PWW reminded the membership that the question pool for the General exam will change on July 1st. He continues to hold testing sessions on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 10 am at 401 W. Sanford St. (use the north side entrance).

Mary AE6Q announced that the evening's presentation would be given by Tom Schuessler N5HYP on the topic of amateur radio satellite communications.

The presentation in May will be given by a guest from MJARS (Mansfield-Johnson Amateur Radio Service) on the subject of noise floor and radio frequency interference. In June there will be a discussion of Field Day, as Field Day starts on the day following the club meeting. The topic of emergency communications will follow in July, with the annual ice cream social and slide show in August.

Virginia NV5F, over the several months, would like to sort out the details of scheduling Joe Eisenberg K0NEB for an in-person visit to Arlington to build a kit with the club. Joe is the kit building editor of CQ magazine, and gave a presentation to the club in March.

David Spore KB3UBD, as Membership Committee chair, informed the membership of the annual AARC picnic, which will be held on Saturday, May 18th, from 9 am to 2 pm. The location of the picnic will be J. W. Dunlop Park, in the pavilion located on the north side of the park. David has received various documents related to the history of the AARC. He will start reviewing the items and categorize them, in a effort to archive the information.

In the absence of Bill AE5BT, Rob May W5WS let the membership know that Field Day 2019 was only 64 days away, being held on the weekend of June 22nd, the fourth full weekend in June. Set up of equipment is scheduled for Saturday morning at 9 am, and pack up on early Sunday afternoon. The current plan includes setting up stations for digital communication, Morse code, side band, GOTA (Get On The Air), and 6 meters. Rob would like to earn extra points for such activities as appointing a safety officer, conducting a

formal education activity, using alternative power, and making a satellite contact.

There will be a barbeque dinner planned for Saturday evening, with the membership asked to bring a side

dish to feed approximately 4 people.

The minutes for the February meetings were submitted for publication in the March newsletter. David Walker W5DJO noted that the monthly hospital net is conducted on the last Friday of the month, and not the third Friday as it appeared in the minutes from the March meeting. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published with the noted correction.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the treasurer's report as published in the newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published.

Virginia NV5F noted that she was contacted by the organizers of the Arlington Heroes Parade, which is scheduled for the early afternoon of Saturday, November 9th. Virginia will inform the organizers that the AARC is interested in providing assistance with communications.

A break was taken at 8:10 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:25 pm with a presentation on amateur radio satellite communications, given by Tom N5HYP.

The meeting adjourned at 9:20 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 20 people in attendance, 19 indicating AARC membership.
