IMAGE FROM SPACE By Philip Scoggins, KD5WBW

Good way to start the new year and decade was to capture an image from the International Space Station (ISS). On December 29<sup>th</sup> and just for curiosity, I checked to see if the ISS was going to schedule any slow scan TV (SSTV) events. I was not sure how far in advance notices are posted. With luck there was one event ending New Year's Day. There were no passes of the ISS over me until January 1<sup>st</sup>. The two opportunities were at times when I didn't plan to be at the radio (3 AM? and 8 AM?) after staying up late.

I used a mag-mount antenna, on a pizza /cookie pan, atop a bookcase, attached to the radio, Signalink USB radio interface, and MMSSTV software. Virginia, NV5F, once said she received some terrestrial SSTV by letting the software capture the images while she did other things. I figured I could let the software work while I slept.

Sorry, I don't remember the details of the passes as far as time or elevation. After the first pass, I woke up for no particular reason. I checked and there was a sliver of an image (Not sure if the image was saved to the computer or just temporarily stored on the software.) I was not too happy with how little I got of the image. Enough was there to claim it was from space but would not impress anyone. I saved it anyway and went back to bed. The next pass provided a better image. Easy enough to ID and was one of the ISS transmissions. Anything recognizable and attributed to coming from space is a thrill. May there be many and better quality

images in coming year(s) and decade(s).
