

Meeting Minutes

June 2020 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was held via teleconference and called to order on June 19th, 2020 at 7:34 pm by the President, David K5NN. Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

David K5NN called the meeting to order and asked the attendees to add their first name and call sign to their teleconference screen name.

Virginia NV5F informed the membership the evening's program would be presented by Rob W5WS and Calvin W7KYG on the topic of tips for operating Field Day as an individual. In the month of July, Calvin will provide a presentation on organizing an ARISS event. August will bring us to the ice cream social. Virginia is planning the presentations for September and October, with November being a show-and-tell.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the June newsletter contained the minutes from the May meeting. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report as it appeared in the June newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published.

The meeting adjourned at 9:00 pm. The teleconference attendance screen showed 24 people in attendance, 23 being AARC members.

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held via teleconference on June 19th, 2020 at 6:49 pm. David K5NN called the meeting to order.

Virginia NV5F mentioned that the program for the evening's meeting would be presented by Rob W5WS and Calvin W7KYG via teleconference on the topic of working Field Day from home. July will be a program on all that goes in to setting up and running an ARISS event. The ice cream social is scheduled for August, assuming social distancing requirements are relaxed by then. She is working on programs for September and October, with a show-and-tell scheduled for November.
