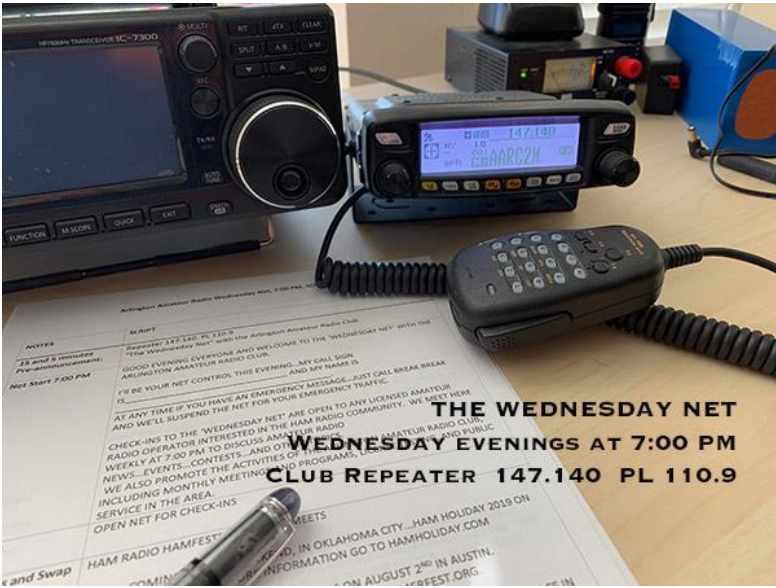
Club Net

Meeting Minutes

August 2020 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was held via teleconference and called to order on August 21st, 2020 at 7:35 pm by the President, David K5NN. Other board members present included Vice President, Virginia NV5F; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; and Editor, Trey AF5XS. Absent was Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT.

David K5NN called the meeting to order. He welcomed the attendees to the 'ice cream social distancing', and reviewed the protocol for the show-and-tell. He mentioned the possibility of receiving a donation of a crank-up tower which could be mounted on a trailer and used for Field Day or other events.

Virginia NV5F informed the membership that she is in communication with David Cripe NM0S to provide a presentation in September. The presentation will be of a historical nature on the topic of utilizing a canteen to build a radio during WWII. She is still working on a presentation for October.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the August newsletter contained the minutes from the July meeting. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report as it appeared in the August newsletter. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published.

Regarding the repeater, there was nothing new to report.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter for August.

Phil N5PWW reported that there are no training classes being held at this time. He continues to provide testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 401. W. Sanford Street (use north side entrance). Phil mentioned that there is a ham in the vicinity of Matlock Road and Debbie Lane that is seeking a mentor. The ham is also in need of transportation to club meetings when in-person meetings resume.

With Bill AE5BT being absent, David K5NN reported 309 days remained until Field Day 2021.

Philip Scoggins KD5WBW, the Public Information Office, had nothing new to report.

David Spore KB3UBD proposed the date of October 9 for the club camping trip. The location is in Smithville, Texas, approximately 4 hours south of DFW. Contact David for additional information.

A break was taken at 8:12 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:20 pm with a show-and-tell by approximately a half dozen club members.

The meeting adjourned at 8:54 pm. The teleconference attendance screen showed 17 people in attendance, all being AARC members.
