ARRL to Extend Field Day Rule Waivers from 2020, Add Class D and E Power Limit

The COVID-19 pandemic-modified <u>ARRL Field Day</u> rules from 2020 will continue this June with the addition of a power limit imposed on Class D (Home Stations) and Class E (Home Stations-Emergency Power) participants. The news from the ARRL Board's Programs and Services Committee comes as many clubs and groups are starting preparations for Field Day in earnest. Field Day 2021 will take place June 26 - 27.

"This early decision should alleviate any hesitancy that radio clubs and individual Field Day participants may have with their planning for the event," said ARRL Contest Program Manager Paul Bourque, N1SFE.

For Field Day 2021, Class D stations may work *all other* Field Day stations, including other Class D stations, for points. This year, however, Class D and Class E stations will be limited to 150 W PEP output.

For Field Day 2021, an *aggregate* club score will be published -- just as it was done last year. The aggregate score will be a sum of all individual entries that attributed their score to that of a specific club.

ARRL Field Day is one of the biggest events on the amateur radio calendar. Last summer, a record 10,213 entries were received.

"With the greater flexibility afforded by the rules waivers, individuals and groups will still be able to participate in Field Day, while still staying within any public health recommendations and/or requirements," Bourque said.

Meeting Minutes

January 2021 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was held via teleconference and called to order on January 15th, 2021 at 7:32 pm by the President, David K5NN. Other board members present included Vice President, Jack AA5VZ; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

David K5NN called the meeting to order. He informed the membership that he has been approached by people interested in obtaining an amateur radio license and becoming involved in the club. Any club members interested in mentoring new hams should contact David.

Jack AA5VZ will be organizing presentations over the next several months with a focus on aspects of the amateur radio hobby for newcomers.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the January 2021 newsletter contained the minutes from the November 2020 meeting. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial reports of November and December 2020. A motion was made and carried to accept the reports for audit as published. There is not an immediate need to visit the repeater site, as it is functioning properly.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter for January 2021.

Phil N5PWW reported that there are no training classes being held at this time. Testing sessions are held promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 401 W. Sanford Street (use north side entrance). Three people are scheduled to attend the next test session. There is a proposed increase in the FCC fee to obtain or upgrade a license, resulting in a cost of \$49.

Bill AE5BT is working with Rob W5WS on a plan to participate in Field Day (only 162 days away) in-person at the usual place, depending on changes in the COVID-19 situation.

Philip KD5WDW, the Public Information Officer, will be taking on the responsibility of sending email to the membership regarding club meetings and the Wednesday evening repeater net.

David K5NN would like to review the bylaws and make suggestions to the membership for changes.

A break was taken at 8:00 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:05 pm with a presentation by Jack AA5VZ on the topic of working FM amateur radio satellites.

The meeting adjourned at 9:10 pm. The teleconference attendance screen showed 24 people in attendance, 20 being AARC members.

January 2021 Executive Board Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held via teleconference on January 15th, 2021 at 6:32 pm. Present were President, David K5NN; Vice President, Jack AA5VZ; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF, Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

David K5NN called the meeting to order. He mentioned that he has observed an increase in inquiries regarding becoming a member of the AARC and training opportunities. He will ask members to volunteer as mentors to people interested in becoming involved in amateur radio. David would care to have a discussion of bylaws changes/clarifications in the future.

Jack AA5VZ informed the board of the presentations he has planned for the next several months. They are along the lines of how to get started in various aspects of amateur radio. David K5NN would like to record the presentations for later posting on the club's website.

Andy KB2VQA confirmed that the January 2021 newsletter contained the minutes from the November 2020 meetings.

Maurice KM5RF, reviewed the financial reports published in the January 2021 newsletter. He paid the liability insurance. Maurice will coordinate with the Public Information Officer to access the list of email addresses of the membership for communications regarding meetings and radio nets. Regarding a visit to the repeater site, Maurice has postponed such a trip due to COVID-19 concerns.

Phil N5PWW reported that there were no training classes in session at this time. He has received email from people interested in amateur radio and the club. Testing sessions are being held promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month. Social distancing is in practice. Fees proposed by the FCC will result in a new license or upgrade costing \$49.

Bill AE5BT has been working with Rob W5WS on a plan to possibly participate in Field Day at the usual place, depending on changes in the COVID-19 situation.

Trey AF5XS published the January 2021 newsletter.

Philip KD5WDW, as the Public Information Officer, posted meeting information on the club's website. The Pickle Parade in Mansfield is scheduled for 2021, after its cancellation in 2020. Philip received an email regarding an opportunity for CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) members to assist in vaccination efforts.

The meeting adjourned at 7:25 pm.
