Meeting Minutes

February 2022 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order on February 18th, 2022, at 7:32 pm by the President, Jack AA5VZ, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Other board members present included Vice President, Philip KD5WBW; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Jack AA5VZ called the meeting to order, and asked attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign. In reviewing the various aspects of his vision for the club in 2022, under the heading of growth opportunities he noted that 13 new-to-the-club members have joined since January 1st.

In regard to promoting club activities, Philip KD5WBW will disseminate information concerning activities in the area. There is an opportunity to apply for grants to support activities benefiting the community.

To provide educational opportunities, the AARC has a lending library containing various amateur radio books. Many club presentations are available on the club's web site. Creation of additional training programs is a possibility in the future.

Encouraging deep involvement in the club and community is supported by the Wednesday night net, which is looking to form a team of net control volunteers. Contact Price K5NNL if you are interested in joining the team. There is also the opportunity to assist with testing of outdoor emergency sirens on the first Wednesday of each month. Another opportunity available to get involved is to assist as a Volunteer Examiner during the twice-monthly testing sessions held on the first and third Saturday of the month at 10 am.

Jack announced Irving ARC would be holding a hamfest on March 5th, from 8 am to 2 pm.

Philip KD5WBW mentioned the AARC will participate in the Mansfield Saint Patrick's Pickle Parade. It's an opportunity to promote the club by entering an AARC float in to the parade. Those interested in participating by decorating or riding in the truck should contact Philip KD5WBW.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the February newsletter contained the minutes from the January meetings. The call sign of Philip KD5WBW as incorrectly recorded as WDW. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published with the noted correction.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report of January 2022. A motion was made and carried to accept the January 2022 report for audit as published.

The audit committee reviewed the financial records of 2021, finding no irregularities.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter for February 2022. All submissions are welcomed and requested to be received by the Saturday before the club meeting.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 401 W. Sanford Street (use the entrance on the north side). There are no training classes being held at this time. There are plans to organize training classes in Mineral Wells and Arlington.

Bill AE5BT informed the membership that Field Day 2022 was 127 days away, starting on Saturday, June 25th. He encouraged everyone to participate. Bill reviewed how to participate in the monthly siren test.

Old business: No old business was presented. New business: No new business was presented. A break was taken at 8:32 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:52 pm with a presentation on HF stealth antennas for beginners, given by Rob W5WS.

The meeting adjourned at 9:42 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 22 people in attendance, 19 indicating AARC membership. Zoom attendees numbered 4.
