Meeting Minutes

June 2022 Membership Meeting Minutes submitted by Andy Kapushoc KB2VQA, Secretary

The regular meeting of the membership of the AARC was called to order on June 17th, 2022, at 7:31 pm by the President, Jack AA5VZ, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Other board members present included Vice President, Philip KD5WBW; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Jack AA5VZ called the meeting to order, and asked attendees to introduce themselves by name and call sign.

Jack mentioned that the club picnic in May was fantastic and thanked David Spore KB3UBD for presenting at last month's meeting on the topic of Parks On The Air (POTA). This evening's presentation will be given by Rob W5WS on the club's upcoming Field Day activities.

Jack mentioned that the monthly siren test was again canceled due to poor weather conditions.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report of May 2022. A motion was made and carried to accept the report for audit as published. Maurice setup a new Logbook of the World certificate for the club. Maurice received the new electrical generator, as well as a 6-gallon extended run fuel tank. The older generator is still functional and will be used as a standby.

Last month the club accepted the donation of equipment from the estate of a silent key. Maurice inventoried and evaluated the items. He proposed that a silent auction be held, with the proceeds to be deposited in the repeater fund. The motion was made and carried.

Maurice reported that the repeater is working fine.

A motion was made and carried to donate to SafeHaven in the sum of \$300.

Philip KD5WBW reported that he will work on a slide show to present to visitors during Field Day, as well as a one-page handout.

Andy KB2VQA noted that the June newsletter contained the minutes from the May meetings. A motion was made and carried to accept the minutes as published.

Trey AF5XS compiled and distributed the newsletter for June 2022. All submissions, including photographs from Field Day, are welcomed and requested to be received by the Saturday before the club meeting.

Phil N5PWW holds testing sessions promptly at 10 am on the first and third Saturdays of the month at 401 W. Sanford Street (use the entrance on the north side). A test session will be conducted at Field Day on Saturday at 10 am. A training class for the Technician Class exam is scheduled for July 2nd and is filled to capacity of 15 participants. The new pool of questions for the Technician Class exam goes into effect on July 1st.

The new \$35 fee proposed by the FCC has now gone in to effect and is collected directly by the FCC from the individual. Phil advised paying the fee promptly to avoid issues.

Bill AE5BT informed the club that Field Day 2022 was only 8 days away, starting on Saturday, June 25th. Setting up the equipment starts at 9 am. Saturday evening there will be a BBQ dinner at 6 pm, and the membership is encouraged to bring side dishes such as fruit salad, beans, cookies, or cakes.

Old business: No old business was presented.

New business: Maurice made a motion to approve the purchase of a theft deterrent bracket for the new generator. The motion carried.

A break was taken at 8:20 pm. The meeting resumed at 8:35 pm. Philip KD5WDW showed a video of the city council meeting where the AARC received the amateur radio proclamation. Rob W5WS reviewed the plans for Field Day.

The meeting adjourned at 9:30 pm. The sign-in sheet showed 17 people in attendance, 16 indicating AARC membership. Zoom attendees numbered 3.

The regular meeting of the Executive Board of the AARC was held on June 17th, 2022, at 6:34 pm, accompanied by a teleconference simulcast. Present were President, Jack AA5VZ; Vice President, Philip KD5WBW; Secretary, Andy KB2VQA; Treasurer and Repeater Trustee, Maurice KM5RF; Training Coordinator and Agent of Record, Phil N5PWW; Emergency Coordinator, Bill AE5BT; and Editor, Trey AF5XS.

Jack AA5VZ called the meeting to order. He mentioned that the club picnic went well in May. The monthly siren test for June was canceled due to poor weather conditions.

Maurice KM5RF reviewed the financial report for May 2022. The club received a donation in the sum of \$100. An expenditure was made to renew the rental of the post office box. Phil N5PWW will close the certificate of deposit.
